NOTICE OF RACE

- The Organising Authority (OA) is Howth Yacht Club CLG (The "Club")
- The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1. RULES

- 1.1 The event will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the Prescriptions of Irish Sailing and the HYC J80 rules.
- 1.2 Where the word 'Member' is used in this document it shall refer to the classes of membership mentioned in the Club's Constitution.
- 1.3 The IRC Rules, Parts A, B, and C shall apply.
- 1.4 One-design boats shall be governed by the relevant Class Rules.
- 1.5 Non-Spinnaker Class boats shall use only one headsail at any time. This changes RRS 55.1. Boats entered for Non-Spinnaker Class racing on Wednesdays shall not use a spinnaker on Saturdays.
- 1.6 Competitors in all Classes shall wear lifejackets or suitable personal flotation devices at all times except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. RRS 40.1 (Personal Flotation Devices) applies.
- 1.7 [NP] Each boat shall carry a serviceable marine band VHF radio and is advised to keep watch on the designated Race Management channel for their race. Failure to receive transmissions from the Race Committee will not be grounds for redress.
- 1.8 Each boat shall carry an anchor and warp aboard whilst racing, capable of being quickly deployed in an emergency and suitable for the particular boat and its area of operation.
- 1.9 Anchors shall not protrude beyond the bow of a boat whilst racing.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Sailing Instructions (SI) will be available online on the HYC website no later than **Thursday 18th April 2024**. (Note: hard copies will not be provided)

3. COMMUNICATION

3.1 The official notice board is located beside the marina office.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The event is open to all boats of the Howth 17 Footer, National Squib and Puppeteer 22 one-design classes and to keelboats racing under IRC/HPH handicap rating systems.
- 4.2 For Saturday Cruiser racing, the IRC and HPH handicap numbers for each boat shall be the rating assigned to the boat for Wednesday racing.
- 4.3 Boats shall be bona fide the property of, or chartered by, Members.
- 4.4 Boats may enter the event by registering online at <u>https://www.hyc.ie/</u>.
- 4.5 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.
- 4.6 Classes 1, 2, 3 and the Non-Spinnaker Class shall race under IRC and HPH handicap systems and boats shall be allocated to a specific Class by the HYC Results team and Sailing Committee.
- 4.7 HYC Results will allocate a performance Time Correction Factor (TCF) to each entrant. This TCF will be updated throughout the season. HPH handicaps will be allocated by HYC Results, in conjunction with the Sailing Committee and relevant Class Captain.
- 4.8 All entrants in performance-based handicap divisions shall nominate a helm to which the performance TCF will apply.
- 4.9 [DP] A competitor shall notify HYC Results, in a timely fashion, of any material change of boat, crew or helm to allow for adjustment of the boat's handicap where deemed appropriate.
- 4.10 A boat may have its handicap reviewed by the Sailing Committee at any time.
- 4.11 Each Cruiser Class boat entering for an IRC division shall submit a copy of their IRC certificate to <u>results@hyc.ie</u> before racing. No alteration in a boat's TCC will be permitted after this date, except as a result of a rating protest or to correct rating office errors.
- 4.12 In crew or other special races, Cruiser Classes shall sail under their current HPH handicaps and One Design Classes shall sail under scratch, with the exception of nominated 'special' handicap races.

5. FEES

5.1 The entry fee for HYC keelboat racing shall be €160.00 per boat.

6. CREW LIMITATIONS [DP]

- 6.1 IRC Rule 22.4 shall not apply. There will be no limitations on crew number or weight, with the exception of the requirements of NOR 6.2 and 6.3.
- 6.2 Except by approval of the Sailing Committee, a boat shall not be raced single-handed.
- 6.3 Sailing Committee encourage skippers and owners to ensure that all crew become Crew Members of the Club.
- 6.4 The helm of any boat racing in a HYC Cclub race shall be member of the Club.
- 6.5 Helms in 'crew' races shall be persons other than those nominated as helms in NOR 4.8.

10. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

10.1 Where relevant, each boat shall produce or verify the existence of a valid measurement or rating certificate when requested to do so by the OA.

12.1 Races will be sailed in the waters North of Howth Harbour.

13. COURSES

13.1 The race area shall be as shown on the TECHNICAL SHEET FOR COURSE CARDS which shall be made available with the SI.

14. PENALTY SYSTEM

15. SCORING

- 15.1 The scoring system shall be as per RRS Appendix A Low Point System. RRS Appendix A Scoring rule A5.3 will apply.
- 15.2 One discard is allowed for every four races completed.
- 15.3 No results shall be allocated for a race where less than two boats come to the starting area. This changes RRS 90.3(a).
- 15.4 Class 2 and Class 3 will be scored as one single fleet.

17. CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS Not used

18. BERTHING

18.1 [DP] Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while in the marina.

19. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS Not used

21. DATA PROTECTION

21.1 Competitors give their consent to the OA to use or to license the use of their name, comments, photographs and likeness as it sees fit for the promotion of the Regatta. The OA reserves the right to uses or to license the use of any images and sound recording during the Event free of charge.

22. RISK STATEMENT

- 22.1 Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.' Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
 - a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
 - b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, the boat in their charge and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
 - c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
 - d) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
 - e) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;

 f) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event;

23. INSURANCE

23.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with adequate, valid, thirdparty cover with an appropriate extension for racing risks.

24. PRIZES

- 24.1 Prizes shall be awarded for each series/division on the basis of average turnout as follows:
 - 2 boats 1st
 - 5 boats 2nd
 - 8 boats 3rd
 - 11 or more boats 4th
- 24.2 For the Mini Series and special races (crew, ladies, etc.), a 1st prize only shall be awarded for each division.
- 24.3 In a Cruiser Class series, a boat shall not be awarded both an IRC and HPH prize. The IRC prize shall take precedence. In a One Design Class series a boat shall not be awarded a scratch and handicap prize. The scratch prize shall take precedence.
- 24.4 Club Racing Perpetual Trophies shall be awarded as listed in the Club Keelboat Racing section of the HYC website.

25. FURTHER INFORMATION

25.1 [DP] Boat Assist: Boats entering for Club racing may be assigned a race date on which the boat will be required to provide assistant(s) to the Race Committee running racing on that date, which may be either from a Committee Vessel or from the East Pier Hut. It is a condition of entry that a boat assigned to provide Race Assist personnel does so. The owner will be advised by their Class Captain of the date and approximate time that the assistant(s) are required to attend and the number of persons (either 1 or 2) that the boat is required to provide for the duty. Any boat failing to meet its obligations in this respect may be subject to protest and imposition of a penalty.
