SAILING INSTRUCTIONS 2012

Note: Markings in the left hand margin signify changes from the 2011 Sailing Instructions

The current course information sheets are deemed to be part of these Instructions.

These Instructions satisfy the requirement of RRS 89.2, 90.2(a) and RRS Appendix J with regard to Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions.

1 – SAFETY

- (A) The attention of all competitors is drawn to RRS Fundamental Rules 3 'Acceptance of the Rules', 4 'Decision to Race' and the ISA Safety Guidelines. Open boat entrants are referred to relevant class Instructions.
- (B) Competitors in all classes (keelboat and dinghy) shall wear lifejackets or suitable personal flotation devices at all times. Wet suits and dry suits are not suitable personal flotation devices.
- (C) It is strongly recommended that every keelboat carries a VHF radio.
- (D) Boats shall keep clear of Race Committee vessels (committee boat, mark laying boats, patrol boats) from the time the Committee Boat is on station prior to starting racing.

2 - INSURANCE

All boats competing in Club races are required to have adequate, valid, third party liability insurance cover.

3 – POWERS DEFINED

- (A) Where the word "Member" is used in these Instructions it shall include all classes of Member mentioned in Club Article 4, except Special Temporary (Crewing) Members.
- (B) The Sailing Committee has power to alter the Racing Programme and Sailing Instructions during the season. Any such alteration shall be posted on the Club Notice Board not less than two hours before the start time of the first race so affected. This alteration will be indicated by displaying flag L on the flagpole at the top of the marina bridge. If deemed necessary, the change will be notified by post to all owners affected who have paid entrance fees for races so affected.

4 – RACING RULES

Races shall be sailed under the 2009 – 2012 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), ISA Prescriptions and the Rules of each Class concerned, except where modified by these Instructions and any amendments thereto.

5 – ELIGIBILITY FOR CLUB RACES

- (A) Boats shall be bona fide the property of, or chartered by, Members and shall be disqualified if any person other than a Member steers during a race (including a crew or ladies' race).
- (B) Advertising on boats shall be restricted to Category A.
- (C) Except by special direction of the Sailing Committee a boat, other than a recognised single-handed dinghy, shall not be raced single-handed.
- (D) The crew in two handed dinghy classes shall be a member.

6 – CREW REGULATIONS

IRC crew limitation and weight limitation Instructions are waived for all Cruiser classes.

7 - ENTRIES

- (A) Entry fees are as specified on the official entry form.
- (B) Boat owners who wish to compete in Club races shall enter either by (1) using the on-line entry facility on the Club web site www.hyc.ie or (2) complete the entry form available on the web site and from outside the Club General Office and send it, together with the relevant fee and handicap certificate(s), to reach the Honorary Sailing Secretary before taking part in any race. Results will be calculated from the time of receipt of the properly completed form. Prior to that a boat shall be recorded DNC (did not compete).

8 - MANAGEMENT OF RACES

- (A) Club races shall be arranged by the Sailing Committee, which shall appoint a Race Officer (RO) who shall be responsible for the management of the races in respect of course selection, signals and recording times. The RO shall have power to postpone or abandon starts for any reason.
- (B) The decision of the RO shall be final in all matters connected with the times at which boats cross the starting or finishing line. A request for redress is, however, permitted.
- (C) Where relevant, information may be transmitted on VHF radio. Channel M (37A) shall be used.
- (D) There shall be no race unless two or more boats rank as starters by sailing in the vicinity of the starting area as defined in Instruction 20 for pier starts and Instruction 21 for Committee Boat starts, between their warning and starting signals.
- (E) A boat that infringes a rule at or near the finishing line and retires shall notify the RO of its retirement as soon as possible.

9 - BOAT ASSISTING

- (A) The Sailing Committee shall appoint an Assistant Race Officer and a designated boat to provide two suitable and knowledgeable adults who shall be on the committee boat not later than one hour before the first scheduled warning signal and not later than 30 minutes before the first scheduled warning signal at the East Pier starters hut.
- (B) Boat Assist crews shall remain on duty until relieved by the RO.

- (C) Should the nominated boat(s) fail to fully comply with these Instructions, it (or the owner's current boat, if relevant) shall carry a non-discardable disqualification for the mid-week race in the week following (Tuesday or Wednesday as relevant). The allocation of the designated boat is based on positions in the previous year's race results and the owner of the boat of that year is responsible for providing helpers.

10 – SAIL NUMBERS

RRS 77 is amended as follows: - Every boat shall show the number under which it is entered on each side of its mainsail, genoa (if relevant) and on its spinnaker (except 17-Footers). Should an owner wish to sail under a different sail number, notice shall be given to the RO before the warning signal of the race concerned. Notice shall be given in each instance of such alteration. Failure to comply with this requirement shall result in the boat being treated as a non-starter. This instruction shall constitute "prior warning" as required by RRS Appendix G4.

11 – CRUISER CLASS IDENTIFICATION

Cruisers shall fly the pennant of their class on the backstay while racing. Those not doing so from their warning signal shall be treated as non-starters, those not doing so as they finish shall be deemed to have retired. This changes RRS 90.3.

12 – PROTESTS

- (A) All protests shall be signalled in accordance with RRS 61.1(a). However, the exemption for boats of hull length less than 6 metres shall not apply.
- (B) Protests and Requests for Redress shall be written on an official Protest Form (available from the bar or downloaded from www.isaf.org or the Club website www.hyc.ie) and left in the protest box in the Clubhouse hallway, received at the Club by fax (839 2430) or by email (results@hyc.ie). The Protest Form shall be received within 24 hours of the end of the race concerned.
- (C) Protests for keelboat classes will be heard in the Clubhouse at 1930 on Thursday in the week next after the race concerned. Where this is not possible, an alternative arrangement will be notified to the protestor and protestee or their representatives.
- (D) Details of protest hearings for dinghy races will be notified verbally or by letter.
- (E) Protest Panels will be prepared for each evening at the start of the season and will be displayed on the Sailing Notice Board. Members of the Protest Panels shall be drawn from names supplied by Class Captains and/or nominated by the Sailing Committee. Panel members shall ensure their availability on the appointed evening. Where required panel members may change places with other panel members. Any changes shall be advised to the Club Protest Convenor.

13 – ASSISTANCE

- (A) The attention of all competitors is drawn to RRS Fundamental Rule 1.1. 'Helping Those in Danger'. If appropriate, the provisions of RRS 62 may be invoked.
- (B) All boats with VHF radios are required to keep a listening watch on Channel 16 when at sea.

14 – "STARRED" RACES

- (A) For One-Design classes only, the Class Captain in consultation with the Honorary Sailing Secretary may request that a Club race, previously scheduled, be starred. This request must be made in writing and received by the Honorary Sailing Secretary at least 72 hours before the scheduled start of the race concerned. Notice of races starred under this procedure will be displayed on the Sailing Notice Board at least 48 hours before the scheduled starting time.
- (B) For dinghy classes, races may be "starred" only for national or regional championships.

15 – CLASSES/HANDICAPS

- (A) Class 1, 2, 3 and the White Sail Cruiser class shall race under IRC and HPH handicap systems and shall be allocated to a specific class by the Handicapping Committee.
- (B) The Handicapping Committee will allocate a performance TCF to each entrant in one-design keelboat classes. This TCF will be updated throughout the season. The Saturday Non-Spinnaker boats will sail under IRC and HPH handicaps which will be allocated by the Handicapping Committee.
- (C) All entrants in performance based handicap divisions shall nominate a helm to whom the performance TCF will apply.
- (D) A competitor is obliged to notify the Handicapping Committee in a timely fashion of any material change of boat or crew. Failure to fulfil this requirement will render a boat liable to penalty.
- (E) A boat/class may have its handicap reviewed by the Handicapping Committee at any time.
- (F) Each cruiser class boat entering for an IRC division shall submit the relevant current valid certificate with the entry form. A boat may protest another boat for any alteration or infringement, which, under the rules of that handicapping system, would invalidate the TCC, issued in accordance with the details submitted.
- (G) In crew or other special races cruiser classes shall sail under their current HPH handicaps and one design classes shall sail under scratch with the exception of nominated handicap special races.
- (H) Helms in crew races shall be persons other than those nominated as helms in Instruction 15 (C).

16 - SCORING SYSTEM

- (A) The scoring system shall be as per RRS Appendix A – Low Point System.
- (B) One discard is allowed for every three races completed.
- (C) Dinghies sailing under the Sundry category will have their times recorded and be scored a finishing position in accordance with the Portsmouth Yardstick (PY) handicap system. Their elapsed times will be recorded and they will be scored a finishing position based on their finishing time after correction using the PY handicap system

17 – CLUB PRIZES

- (A) Club prizes shall be awarded for each series/division, as specified in the Club Series section of this booklet, on the basis of average turn out as follows: 2 boats –1st, 5 boats –2nd, 8 boats –3rd, 11 or more boats –4th. For the Mini Series and special races (crew, ladies etc.) a 1st prize only shall be awarded for each division.
- (B) Only members are eligible to win a prize.
- (C) In cruiser class series a boat shall not be awarded an IRC and HPH prize, the IRC prize shall take precedence. Similarly, a Class 2 boat shall not be awarded an IRC restricted division prize and an IRC prize, the IRC prize shall take precedence. In one-design class series a boat shall not be awarded a scratch and handicap prize, the scratch prize shall take precedence.

18 – STARTING TIMES FOR CLUB RACES

- (A) Races will be started as per RRS 26 with the warning signal given 5 minutes before the starting signal. A countdown from 1 minute before each start may be given on VHF radio.
- (B) A boat shall not start later than 15 minutes after her valid starting signal.
- (C) Starting times are as follows:

There will be a 'Sign out / Sign in' register which must be signed personally by the helmsman of each boat competing. This will be located in the Race Office. Failure to sign-in or sign-out will result in the boat in question being scored as DSQ for all races sailed on the day in question without a protest hearing and may result in further action at the discretion of the Race Committee. This changes Rule 63.1 and Appendix A4.1 and A5.

If a class of boat destined to race in the Sundry category has 6 or more entrants, that class will be accorded its own race. Should such a situation arise, the Race Officer will advise competitors in this class of the starting arrangements for them and the course to be sailed.

Start sequence for Thursday and Sunday races shall normally be: Sundries (including Fevas) and Optimists. The first start on Thursdays is scheduled for 7pm and for Sundays is 10.30am. Class flags for the different fleets shall be Sundry – Flag F and Optimists – Flag O.

The Race Committee may, at its discretion, amalgamate starts to expedite racing and this shall be signalled by the simultaneous display of the Class flags of those classes that are to start together.

* **Note:** If on Tuesday or Wednesday Instruction 23 (B) is invoked, Pier Starts will be substituted.

19 – TIME LIMITS

(A) The time limit for each keelboat race is as follows:

(B) Provided a keelboat (including SB3s) finishes within the time limit, it shall be extended by 15 minutes (Saturdays 30 minutes) for that class.

(C) When a single race is scheduled the target time is 75 minutes. When two races are scheduled the target time for each race is 40 minutes for Fevas & Sundries, 35 minutes for Optimists. Failure to meet the target times will not be grounds for redress. Where the intention is to hold two races, the time limit for the first boat in each class, in each start, shall be 60 minutes. A boat failing to finish within 10 minutes of the first boat in her class will be scored the place of the last boat finishing within the time, plus one point. Where the intention is to hold one race, the time limit for the first boat in each class shall be 90 minutes. A boat failing to finish within 15 minutes of the first boat in her class will be scored with the place of the last boat finishing within the time, plus one point. This paragraph changes Rules A4.1 and A5.

20 – KEELBOAT STARTING AREA, PIER STARTS

(A) The starting area is defined as being bounded by an imaginary line drawn from the new lighthouse to the South Rowan Buoy, to the Howth Mark, to the elbow of the East Pier.

(B) In cruiser classes, no boat shall enter this area between the time of the warning signal for the first of the series of starts and that class's warning signal.

(C) The Race Committee may lodge a protest against a boat that enters the keelboat starting area, as defined in Instruction 20 (A), between the time of the warning signal for the first of the series of starts on the day and the boat's warning signal.

21 - KEELBOAT STARTING AREA, COMMITTEE BOAT STARTS

(A) The starting area is defined as being an imaginary line drawn from the Island Mark, to the Cush Mark, to the West Mark, to the Viceroy Mark, to the Island Mark.

(B) Boats shall keep clear of the starting line until their warning signal.
Boats having started shall keep clear of the starting line while other starts are in progress.

22 – KEELBOAT STARTING LINE, PIER STARTS

(A) The starting line shall be one of the following, identified by a letter A, B or C displayed on the starter's hut/Committee Boat :-

Starting Line A: A line between the red vertical line on the starter's hut and the South Rowan Buoy.

Starting Line B: A line between the red vertical line on the starter's hut and Finish Mark F or the red and white pole/mainmast on the Committee Boat.

Starting Line C: A line between the red vertical line on the starter's hut and the Howth Mark.

(B) For all west going starts, boats shall pass to the south of the South Rowan Buoy.

(C) For all east going starts, boats shall pass south of the Finish Mark (F). Should Mark F be missing, flag H will be displayed and boats shall pass south of the Howth Mark.

23 – KEELBOAT STARTING LINE, COMMITTEE BOAT STARTS

(A) The starting line shall be between the red and white pole/mainmast on the Committee Boat and an Outer Distance Mark, an orange buoy, which shall be left to port when starting. The Race Committee may adjust the starting line up to three minutes before the start of a race. This changes RRS 27.2.

(B) Following a General Recall, the recalled class shall immediately sail clear of the starting area. The new Warning Signal for the recalled class shall be the Starting Signal of the last class in the published sequence. This changes RRS 29.2

- (C) Should flag D be displayed at the East Pier starter's hut, Committee Boat and/or the Committee Boat and/or the marina bridge, accompanied by one sound signal, pier starts and relevant Instructions will be substituted for offshore committee boat starts.

24 – KEELBOAT PIER FINISHING LINE

- (A) The finishing line shall be between the Finish Mark F and the red vertical line on the East Pier starter's hut.
(B) Should the Committee Boat be on station at the Finish Mark F then the finishing line shall be between the red and white pole/mainmast on the Committee Boat displaying a blue flag and the red vertical line on the East Pier starter's hut.

25 – KEELBOAT COMMITTEE BOAT FINISHING LINE

- (A) The finishing line shall be a line between the red and white pole/mainmast on the Committee Boat displaying a blue flag and an orange Finish Mark, which shall be left to port.
(B) Unless the course is shortened, the finish line for cruiser classes is located approximately upwind of the last fixed mark on the course.
(C) Unless the course is shortened, the finish line for one design keelboat classes is between the red and white pole/mainmast of the Committee Boat, displaying a blue flag, and situated in the area marked "Tuesday Night Finish Area" on the Course Card and an orange Finish Mark which shall be left to port.

26 – DINGHY STARTING AREA

- (A) Pier Starts - The starting area is to the west of the West Pier.
(B) Committee Boat Starts – The starting area is North West of the harbour mouth.

27 – DINGHY STARTING LINE

- (A) The starting line shall be between the mainmast of the Committee Boat and an orange Outer Distance Mark, which shall be left to port when starting.
(B) All dinghies shall keep clear of the starting line until their warning signal.
(C) Boats shall not pass through the start/ finish when either a Class flag or a blue flag is displayed on the Committee Boat unless they are finishing. Any boat in breach of this instruction shall be scored as DNF without a protest hearing. This changes Rule 63.1 and Appendix A4.1 and A5.

28 – DINGHY FINISHING LINE

- (A) The finishing line shall be between the mainmast of the Committee Boat and an orange finish mark, which shall be left to port.
(B) The Outer Distance Mark may be repositioned during a race.

29 – NAVIGATION MARKS/OBSTRUCTIONS, KEELBOATS

- (A) In keelboat classes the navigation marks in and around Howth Sound shall be left as follows after a boat's starting signal:
South Rowan Buoy: to be passed to the south and west.
Howth Mark: not a mark on any course except as in Instruction 22 (C).
Rowan Rocks Buoy: to be passed to the east and south.
Spit Mark: to be passed to the north and east (except when used as rounding mark on Pier Start Course Card)
Where the Thulla and Finish Mark (except when finishing) are described as marks on the course, they shall be passed to the south.
(B) Any part of Ireland's Eye capable of being touched by a boat, while racing, is designated as an obstruction to sea room.
(C) The attention of competitors is drawn to the existence of many underwater hazards in the vicinity of Ireland's Eye, Howth Sound and over the Spit Bank. Should they choose to sail amongst these hazards, they do so at their own risk. The Club accepts no responsibility for the consequences of any such deviation from the set courses.

30 – DESCRIPTION OF MARKS

- (A) **Keelboats:** The marks are as specified on the relevant course card.
(B) **Dinghies:** Marks are orange buoys

31 – ABANDONMENT/POSTPONEMENT

Abandonment before the starting signal/ postponement shall be as per RRS 27.3. Flag signals will be made from the Committee Boat, starter's hut or the top of the marina bridge, as relevant.

32 – ABANDONMENT AFTER THE START

Abandonment of a race after the start shall be as per RRS 32.1. However, if not all races are being abandoned flag N shall be displayed over the class flag of the classes affected.

33 – FINISHING A RACE

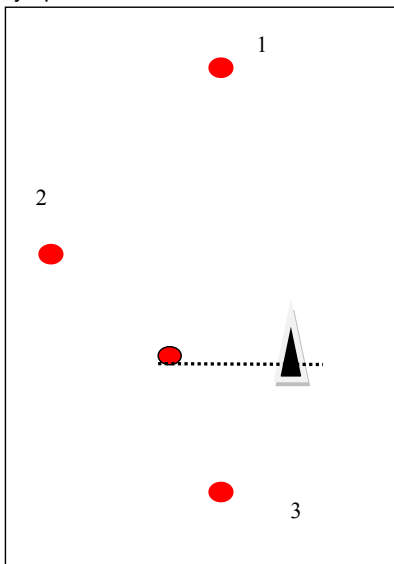
- (A) Keelboats having finished shall not recross their own finishing line in the opposite direction except for some unavoidable cause. Any so doing may be penalised. Only the Race Committee may lodge a protest.
(B) Dinghies having finished shall not recross their own finishing line in the opposite direction.

34 – NOTIFICATION OF COURSE

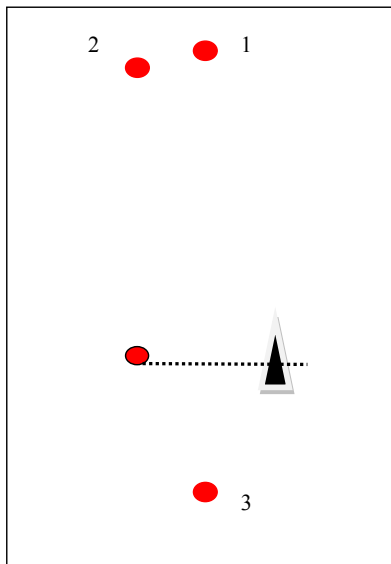
- (A) Courses will be chosen by the Race Officer from the Course Cards. Separate tables of courses are provided for Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Saturdays (Pier Starts). These course tables, together with the procedures for displaying courses for pier starts, form part of these Sailing Instructions.
(B) RRS 27.1 is changed as follows: - The course board(s) shall be displayed for each class following its warning signal and shall be displayed for not less than 4 minutes (dinghies 3 minutes) before the start.

- i. All marks shall be left to Port.
- ii. Marks shall normally be orange buoys.
- iii. Course type to be indicated with Flag – T for Olympic Triangle and W for Windward Leeward. The flag indicating the course type to be used shall be displayed not later than the Preparatory signal for the first Class scheduled to start. The respective course layouts are indicated on the diagrams below.
- iv. The starting line shall be between the mainmast of the Committee Boat and an outer limit mark.
- v. Where an Olympic Triangle is in use, boats shall start, sail a triangle around marks 1, 2, and 3, then from 1 back to 3, followed by another triangle and then, where Classes are sailing more than 3 rounds, a lap of marks 1 and 3, followed by a further triangle. Each time a boat passes mark 3 on the way from another mark it shall be deemed to have completed a round.
- vi. After completing the required number of rounds for the Class it is part of, the boat shall finish between the Committee Boat and the outer limit mark, unless the race is shortened.
- vii. Where a Windward Leeward course is in use, marks 1 and 2 will be adjacent to each other and each lap of the course shall be around all three marks shown on the course diagram below.
- viii. In the event of the Race Committee deciding to shorten a race but have a fleet (or fleets) finish at the Finishing Line (as opposed to at a Mark in compliance with RRS 32.2a), a boat stationed at the last mark to be rounded shall display flag V and make repeated sound signals as the boats round it. After rounding, the boats shall then proceed directly to the Finishing Line and finish. If flag V is displayed on its own then all Classes racing shall have their course shortened. Where the display of flag V is accompanied by one or more Class flags then all Classes whose flag(s) are displayed shall have their course shortened. When the boat displaying flag V is in the vicinity of Marks 1 and 2, the last mark rounded by Classes whose course is shortened shall be Mark 2. This changes RRS 32.

The RO may at his discretion decide to shorten a race. The procedure will be either: -

- (A) A Finish Boat will be positioned at the mark on the course at which the race is to be finished. Flag S will be displayed and two sound signals made as the leading boat approaches the mark at which the race is to be finished. Boats shall finish between the Finish Boat and the relevant mark. Flag S displayed alone signals that all races not yet finished are shortened, flag S over class flag(s) signals that races for the relevant classes are shortened.
- (B) For courses that prescribe a leg passing up or down the Sound, the RO may decide to shorten the race using the East Pier finishing line. Flag S will be displayed and two sound signals made as the leading boat approaches the finishing line. Flag S displayed alone signals that all races not finished are shortened. Flag S over class flags signals that races for the relevant classes are shortened.
- (C) When courses 40x and 50x are in use, special procedures for shortening course are detailed on the Course Card.

36 – DINGHIES SHORTENED COURSE

- (A) Displaying flag S and making two sound signals as the leading boat approaches the finishing line will signal a shortened course. This may be signalled from a rescue boat/committee boat situated in the vicinity of the last mark of the shortened course. Boats shall sail to the finishing line after rounding this mark. The rescue boat displaying flag S will not form part of the finishing line.
- (B) A course may also be shortened at a course mark from a rescue /committee (finish) boat, which will display flag S flag and make two sound signals. The finishing line shall be between the S flag and the relevant mark.
- (C) Flag S displayed alone signals that all races not finished shall be shortened, flag S displayed superior to class flags signals that races for the relevant classes are shortened.

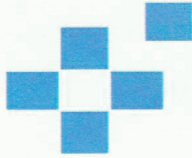
