WHERE RHIANNON RECOMMENDS:

“The Amalfi Coast is best experienced in the quieter moments — Capri early in the morning, Nerano over a long lunch, or Procida at sunset when the harbour belongs to the fishing boats again. Timing changes everything here.”

Procida is one of the most authentic islands in the Bay of Naples, often overlooked for Capri. Procida is softer, slower. It offers a more local side of coastal Italy — pastel harbours, excellent seafood and evenings that feel unhurried in the best possible way.

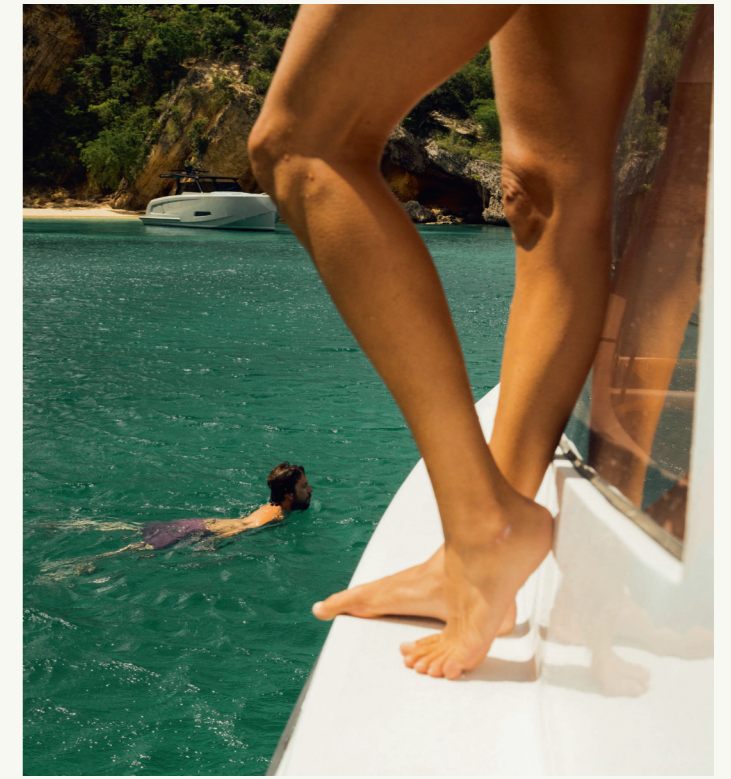
Less Rush, More Rhythm

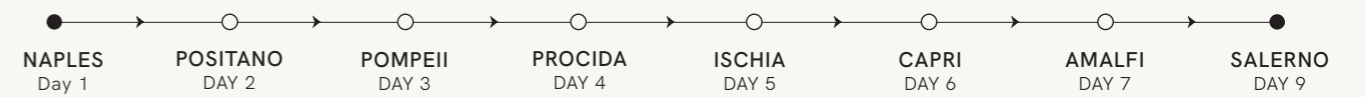

Go With The Flow

Italy is home to some of Europe's most memorable restaurants, but what changes when you travel by yacht is everything around them.

A table at Don Alfonso 1890, where lunch becomes an occasion in itself — refined, seasonal and deeply rooted in southern Italian tradition. Arrive for a long, unhurried afternoon shaped by Michelin-starred cuisine, estate-grown ingredients and one of Italy's most storied family kitchens. Seafood in Procida while the harbour still belongs to local fishermen and the island retains its quiet, authentic rhythm. A long lunch in Capri before the crowds arrive, followed by cocktails back on deck — the coastline unfolding in golden light — before heading ashore for dinner.

There is no rush to get there. No summer traffic along the coast. No long transfers shaping the day. You arrive by water, quietly and at the right moment, and leave just as easily when the evening is done.

That freedom changes how time feels. Sailing gives you space around the experience — time to stay longer, slow down, and let the day unfold naturally.

A long lunch or a later table may seem like a small shift in pace, but it changes the journey entirely.

Because in Italy, the best moments are rarely the ones you rush.

POSITANO

A Table Known Locally

While Positano draws the eye, the most memorable evenings are found just beyond it. In the quiet cove of Marina di Praia, Trattoria Da Armandino sits at the water's edge — long favoured by locals for its understated approach to coastal cooking. Arriving by boat, just as the light begins to soften, offers a more intimate way to experience the Amalfi Coast at dinner.



POMPEII

History, Privately Guided

Pompeii reveals far more in the right company. Explored with a private guide, the ancient city shifts from vast ruins to something far more personal — a detailed insight into Roman life, preserved in extraordinary clarity. It's a cultural experience designed with the same level of care as time spent on the water.

PROCIDA

Rooted In Place

Lemons shape daily life on Procida, grown in small garden groves and used with a simplicity that defines the island's cooking. Insalata di limone, granita taken mid-afternoon, or pastries filled with sharp citrus cream are all part of daily life. For a deeper understanding, time can be arranged with a local family, where recipes are shared as they have been for generations — simple, seasonal and entirely shaped by what grows here.

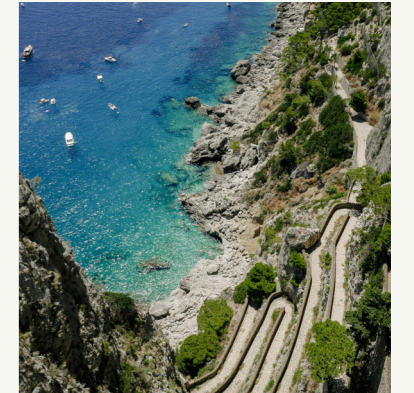


ISCHIA

Gardens & Destination Dining

La Mortella is one of those places best experienced slowly — a private garden built in layers, where subtropical planting, shaded paths and sea views unfold quietly as you move through it.

Dani Maison sits away from the coast, set within chef Nino Di Costanzo's own home, and reached through a garden where aperitifs are taken before dinner. With only a handful of tables, it's firmly destination dining.



CAPRI

Gardens Above The Sea

Set high above the coastline, the Gardens of Augustus offer a quieter vantage point over Capri. From here, the Faraglioni rise from the water below, framed by terraces of greenery — a moment removed from the island's busier pace.



AMALFI

Coastal Detail & A Final Evening

In Amalfi, time ashore is best taken slowly — through its cathedral square and narrow streets, where the layers of the coast's history become clear. The journey ends just beyond, in Praiano, where dinner at Un Piano Nel Cielo is defined by both setting and precision — a final evening shaped by stillness, light and the coastline stretching out below.

Islands, Harbours & Adriatic Light

Sailing in Croatia



Scattered along Croatia's central Adriatic coast, the islands of Dalmatia combine limestone coves, pine-fringed bays and some of the region's most atmospheric old towns. Seen from the water, the landscape feels both softer and more expansive — fortified harbours, vineyard-covered hills and quiet inlets appearing between island channels and open sea.

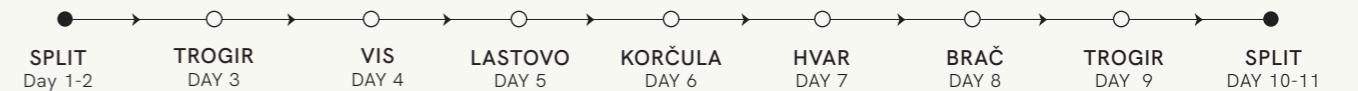
Exploring Central Dalmatia by yacht offers a natural way to experience Croatia's coast, particularly for families travelling together.
